Dear Handbell Directors and Ringers,

The 15th Western Pennsylvania Handbell Festival (WPA) will be held **Saturday**, **April 18, 2015!** Our location is the campus of **Robert Morris University (RMU)** in **Moon Township**, PA, near the Pittsburgh International Airport. This is a wonderful venue for our rehearsals, classes, and concert, and we are ecstatic to return to RMU again this year. The WPA Festival is co-sponsored by **Three Rivers Ringers**, Pittsburgh's premier handbell ensemble, the **Robert Morris University Band Program**, and **Musik Innovations**. Members of Three Rivers Ringers will be teaching and performing at the festival, as well as planning the event. The Robert Morris Band Program, under the direction of Elisabeth H. Charles, has been vital in helping us secure space at the RMU campus. They will be working with Three Rivers Ringers to handle all of the behind-the-scenes work to make this year's event a success. The event is endorsed by the Handbell Musicians of America. Send your registration forms in now; this is one festival you don't want to miss!

You will love the music for this year's WPA Festival! Please listen to all of the selections using the provided links, and do not hesitate to ask us questions about the repertoire. All festival music will be available at Musik Innovations. As usual, the music list has been designed to take your choir through the church year. There are two original compositions by Fred Gramann and Michael Mazzatenta that can be used anytime you need an upbeat addition to worship. Traditional hymn tune Lobe den Herren (*Praise to the Lord, the almighty*) and the Spanish hymn (*Come Christians, join to sing*) are joined by the popular contemporary classic, *You are mine*, from the pen of David Hass and arranged by Lloyd Larson. The 1966 carol by Kathleen Thomerson, *I want to walk as a child of the light*, will provide a particularly lovely start to your Advent season. You will want to consider adding the optional C instrument.

In addition to registering as a full choir, you can also register for the festival as a partial choir or as an individual. If so, please contact our Festival Registrar, Cynthia Donahoe. Additionally, please let Cynthia know if you will have unassigned bell positions during the festival as these may be filled by those registering as individuals. Consider showing off your choir by playing a solo at the festival concert! Solo numbers are always great additions to a concert program and can give your ringers something to shoot for as they develop their ringing skills over the course of the year.

Our clinician this year is **David L. Weck**, Music Editor for Hope Publishing and Director of The Agape Ringers. We are thrilled that David is coming to Pittsburgh! As many of you know, David has directed numerous national and international handbell events, including several International Handbell Symposiums (Toronto, Canada; Orlando, Florida; Osaka, Japan), Distinctly Bronze, an event for advanced ringers, (2012), and the Hong Kong

Handbell Festival (2013). He has served on the national board of The Handbell Musicians of America and was given the Midwest States' Area 8 Outstanding Service Award. In 2011, AGEHR (now Handbell Musicians of America) named him an Honorary Life Member, their highest honor.

Are you a new Director? Are you thinking about starting a new handbell ensemble? Do you need conducting tips and score study? The festival will offer **two seminars for directors** to address these issues led by Nancy Lutz, Artistic Director of Three Rivers Ringers, and Elisabeth H. Charles, Director of Bands at Robert Morris University. Each seminar is offered for a fee of \$25. Details are contained in the accompanying Director's Seminar letter.

Speaking of directors, we would like to extend an invitation to all those directors registering for the festival to attend a Director's Luncheon held in a special reserved area of RMU's Nicholson Center Food Court. David L. Weck, Elisabeth H. Charles, and Nancy Lutz, look forward to greeting you and discussing topics of interest during the lunch break.

Frequently Asked Questions

WHY SHOULD I BRING MY CHOIR TO A HANDBELL FESTIVAL?

Coming to a handbell festival is a wonderful way to play with other handbell musicians, work with **David L. Weck**, our Handbell Clinician, and learn more about the music and techniques that enhance our ability to create wonderful handbell experiences for both ringers and listeners. Plus, you will have lots of fun!

WHY SHOULD I REGISTER MY CHOIR FOR THE WESTERN PENNSYLVANIA HANDBELL FESTIVAL (WPA) BY JANUARY 31, 2015?

You should register early to take advantage of the **\$85/choir Early-Bird** discounted Registration Fee (a \$15 savings) and to ensure that your choir is able to attend the 2015 WPA Festival. Space in RMU's John Jay Center Gymnasium is limited. You don't want to miss out! We will of course accept registrations until the March deadline, as long as we have space available. **Classes are filled on a first-come first-served basis, so register early!**

WHAT IF MY WHOLE CHOIR CANNOT COME?

You can register for the festival as a partial choir or as an individual (\$15 per person). If attending as a partial choir, just let our Festival Registrar, Cynthia Donahoe, know the number of feet required by your group on the ringing floor. Additionally, let Cynthia know if you will have unassigned bell positions during the festival; these may be filled by those registering as individuals or by members of the Three Rivers Ringers. Individuals may pool together and register as a partial choir or opt to be assigned a spot with another choir.

WILL WE NEED TO BRING TABLES AND PADS?

Once again, we are offering to provide tables to those groups opting not to transport their own tables. **Due to rising costs, we have had to include a \$5/table charge to offset the expense of providing tables**. Just indicate the total number of feet needed on the WPA Registration Form. **You will need to provide your own pads and table covers (if you use them).**

ARE THERE HOTELS CLOSE TO THE FESTIVAL VENUE?

This year we are also offering the option for individuals and/or groups to bring a packed lunch. BEGINNING DIRECTORS SEMINAR/CONDUCTING WORKSHOP

September 2014

To beginning handbell directors and potential handbell directors:

On Saturday, April 18, 2015, the Western PA Handbell Festival will be held at Robert Morris University in Moon Township. This one-day festival is designed for handbell choirs that play level 1 and 2 music (selections that are on the easier side of the difficulty scale). You are invited and encouraged to participate in two learning experiences for beginning handbell/handchime directors and those who are considering assuming this position.

In the morning we will spend the first 30 minutes of the seminar, from 9-9:30 A.M., observing the festival conductor, then spend the next 2.5 hours having a roundtable discussion while the festival rehearsal is taking place.

In the afternoon, during the third scheduled mass rehearsal we will adjourn to the Nicholson Center Conference Room for a workshop on conducting techniques. We hope all of you can stay for the entire day to observe rehearsals, attend the Director's Luncheon, and participate in the afternoon classes. The festival concert is at 5:30 P.M.

Topics to be covered in the morning seminar include:

Equipment: What do I need and how do I take care of it?

Ringers: How many ringers do I need?

What skills do new ringers need?

Music: How do I know what music I should buy?

How do I "prepare" the music I have selected?

Rehearsal: How do I prepare myself for the first rehearsal?

How do I teach my ringers the music?

How do I run an effective rehearsal?

Techniques: What exactly are handbell/handchime techniques?

How can I learn them? How do I teach them?

Conducting: How do I communicate with my ringers?

Education: Where can I learn more?

Are there books that can help me?

Topics to be covered in the afternoon workshop may include conducting do's and don'ts, basic conducting patterns, tips for teaching rhythms, emphasizing musicality in your rehearsals and all your questions answered.

The morning seminar clinician will be Nancy Lutz. She is the Artistic Director of Three Rivers Ringers, Pittsburgh's premier handbell ensemble. Nancy is also director of handbells at Mt. Lebanon United Methodist Church in Pittsburgh where she has two adult ensembles. Nancy is active at both the Area 2 and national levels of Handbell Musicians of America.

The afternoon Conducting Workshop will be led by Elisabeth Heath Charles. She is a former member of Three Rivers Ringers and also rings with The Chapel Bells at Mt. Lebanon United Methodist Church. From 2001–2005 she rang with the Ladies Handbell Team and also served as the Conductor of Ringers II Handbell Team for the Southminster Presbyterian Church of Mt. Lebanon. Mrs. Charles is the Director of Bands at Robert Morris University and was previously the Conductor and Music Director of the Butler County Symphony Orchestra.

If you are in need of help and suggestions or even if you just want some new ideas, please consider registering for the Beginning Director's Seminar/Conducting Workshop. The cost for each seminar is \$25. You may register by email or by writing to Cynthia Donahoe, event registrar. Checks should be made to Western PA Directors' Group.

Both the 3-5 octave and 2-3 octave settings for handbells can be used as optional accompaniments to the voices. The energetic forces, created by the rhythmic use of mallets accompanying this powerful tune, make this a dynamic worship choice for many occasions. This selection was used at the 2001 and 2008 WPA Festivals and was written before level designations were assigned to music.

A short original melody comprises the introduction, interludes, and ending. In the second stanza, the upper treble bells are played with mallets, while the hymn tune is played by the lower treble and bass. C or Bb instrument optional.
